



Pupil Premium Report Allocation 2016 - 2017



Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. It is allocated to:

- children of statutory school age who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years (also known as Ever 6 FSM)
- children who are looked after by the local authority
- children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

At Keelby Primary Academy we work hard to support disadvantaged pupils. We regularly review our actions and their impact to ensure improved outcomes for pupils. We are committed to 'closing the gap' between all pupils and any specific cohort or group of pupils. We also ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, priority groups or individuals.

The DFE offer the following guidance on how the Pupil Premium is to be spent:

'In most cases the Pupil Premium is allocated to schools and is clearly identifiable. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools per FSM pupil, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility...[Schools] will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low income families.'

The purpose of the information on this page is to inform parents, carers and governors how much Pupil Premium has been received by the school for 2016/2017, how it will be spent and the impact previous spending has had on pupils' achievement. At Keelby Primary Academy, 18% of pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding, which is below the National Average of 25.2%.

Pupil Premium 2016-17

The school received a total pupil premium budget of £40,920 for the academic year **2016-17**. The table below sets out how this money is allocated.
